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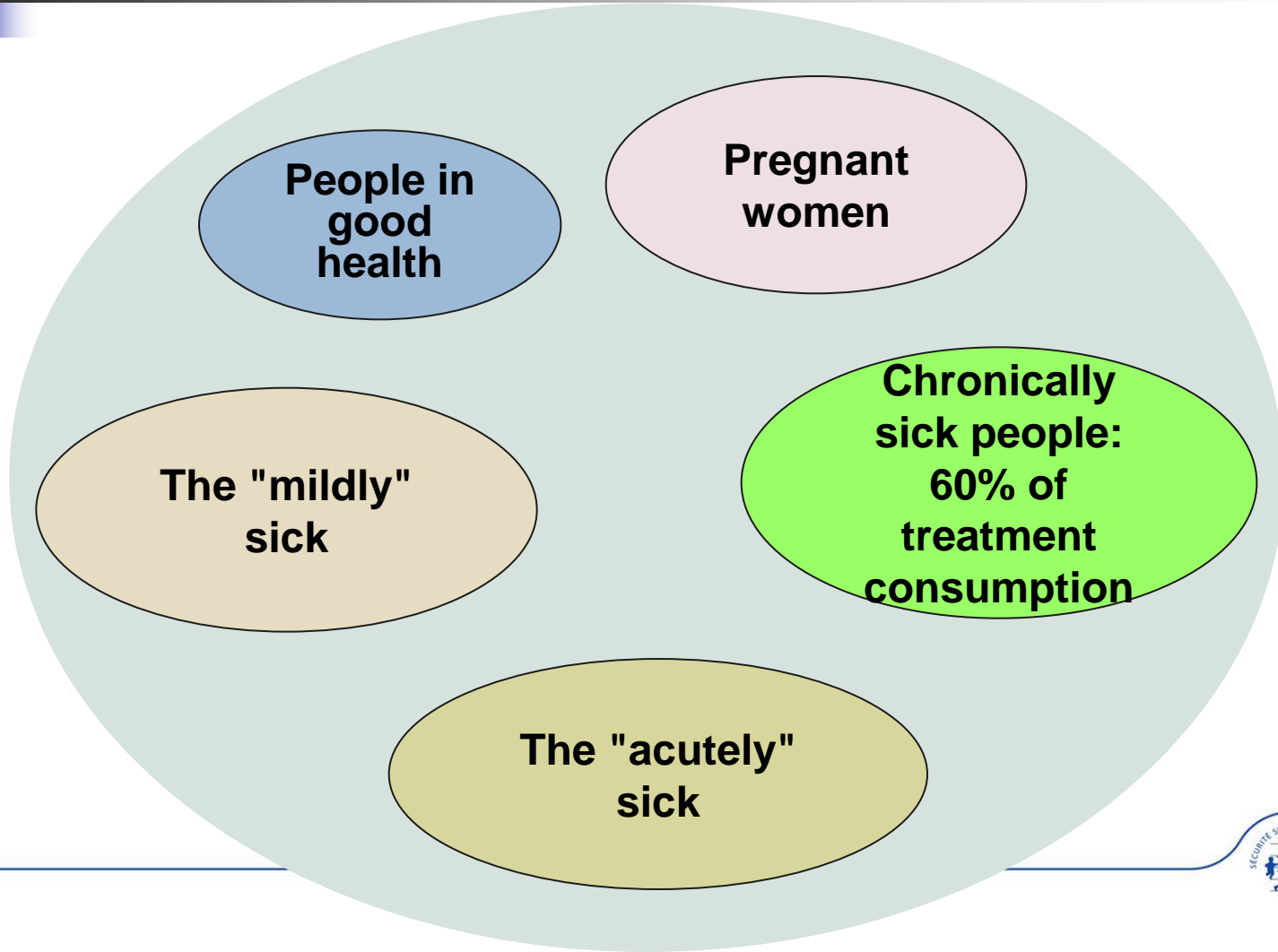
The context of its creation

People insured must be actively involved in their health. They must:

- have reliable, objective information about their illness, concerning:
 - prevention
 - using the healthcare system wisely
 - good behaviour
 - medical follow-up
- be sent to the right place within the healthcare system.

For this, Assurance Maladie (the national healthcare system) has created the ameli-santé website

Site targets = all those insured

The health themes are divided into five categories:

- serious pathologies
- everyday problems
- symptoms
- emergency situations
- prevention



Writing themes

The themes are written using academic references, by:

- medical advisors
- a service provider

It emerged that the search for academic references was a specialist activity.

This mission was given to me.



The problem to be solved

The academic references found had to be made available to all the writers.

There were twenty writers dispersed throughout France.

Hence the creation of a virtual library accessible to all via the Internet.

At present, it contains about 5 700 references.



Creation of the virtual library

It was built on Diigo.com and enables:

- to index the references and to classify using keywords (tags)
- to comment about each reference
- to form more accessible reference lists for writers

What the asclepios library contributed

With the availability of documentation via this on-line library, the writers were able to draft 245 documented health themes.

They update the themes as new references appear.

There has been no questioning of the site content, with an average of more than a million visits per month during the first six months of 2014.



Virtual libraries

- Library management is secured by a password
- The administrator may be the only one with permission to index the references.
- But he may give the password to several colleagues who will then be involved in the development of the library.



Virtual libraries

- On social bookmarking sites, each library is identified.
- They constitute a body of knowledge made available to a community of professionals.
- Documents available on the Web but also via an Intranet can be referenced in them. In this case, only those with access to the Intranet will be able to access them.

Virtual libraries

These libraries can therefore be used to pool baseline documents governing professional practices.

They are particularly useful:

- to project leaders
- to members of a working group
- to professionals working in quality groups
- to peer groups
- to healthcare networks
