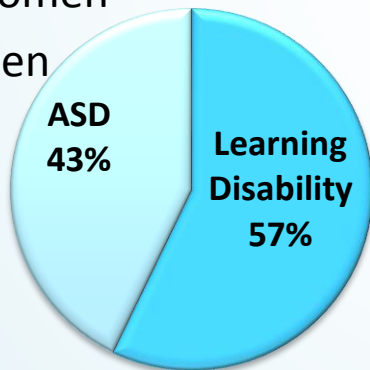
- Changes in Swedish social insurance system in Jan-2011

35 Participants

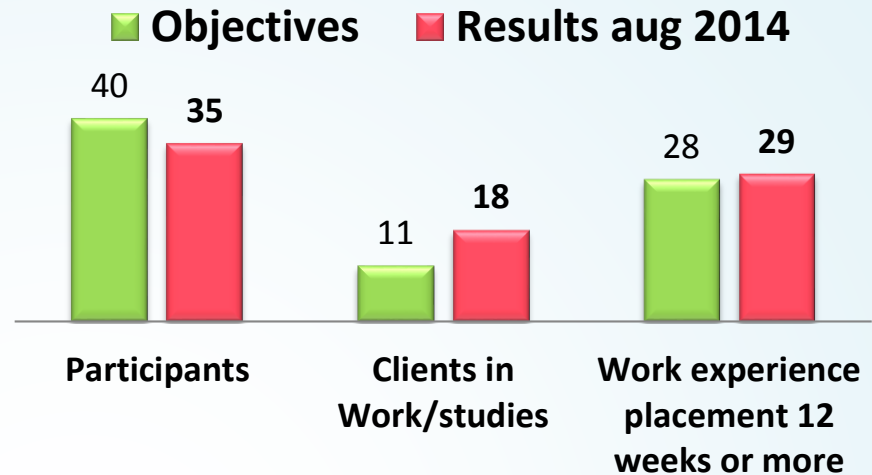
18 – 32 years

19 (54%) men



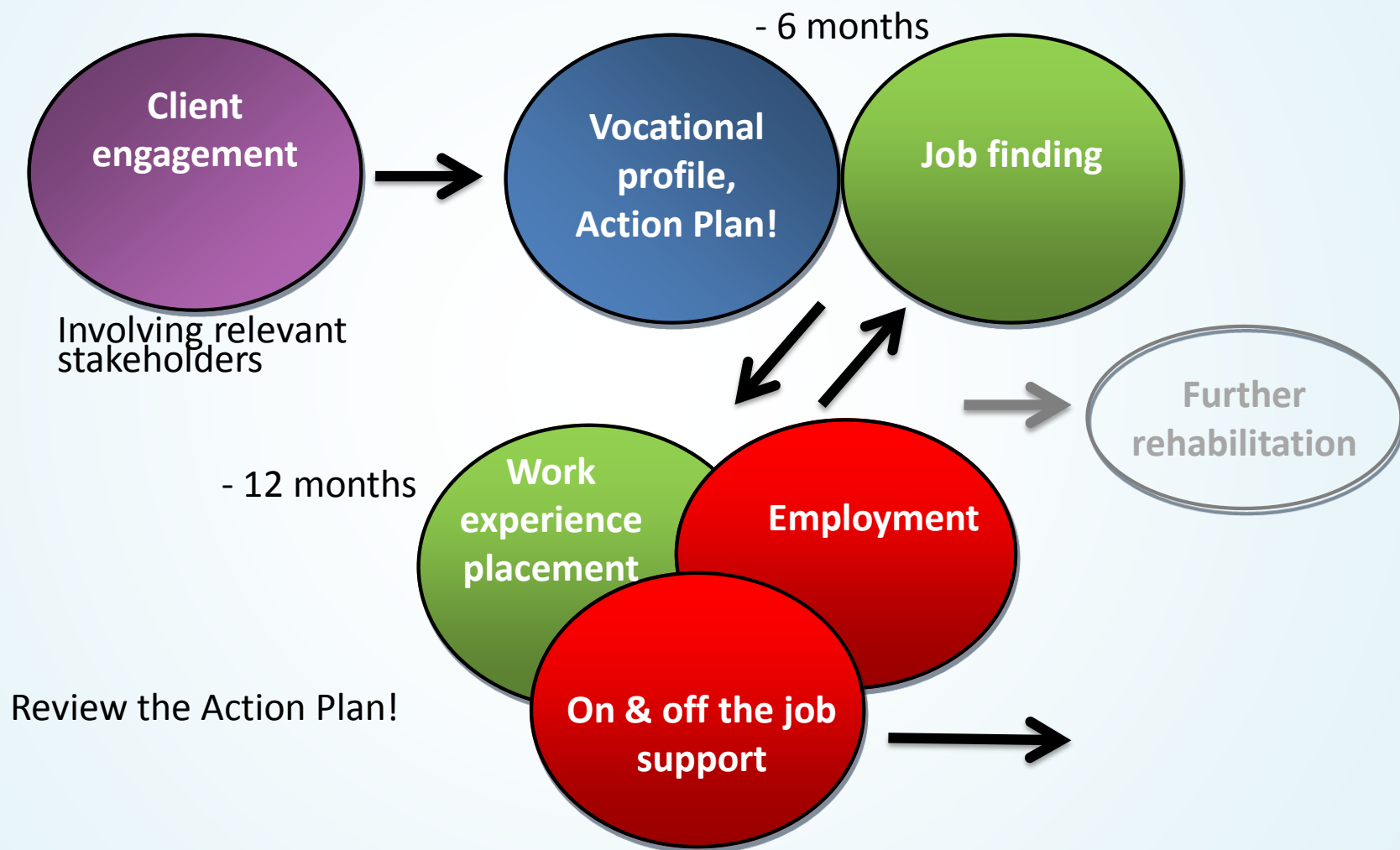
54% have multiple diagnoses
